COMMUNITY SAVINGS BANK EMPLOYEE-FUNDED \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP



Eligibility

- Applicant must be a high school senior
- Applicant must be planning to attend post-secondary school

Scholarship Description

- This scholarship will require a written essay to be submitted to Community Savings Bank. It is merit based and does not depend on financial standing.

Essay Requirements

- Must have a cover sheet
- Must be between 600 1000 words.
- The essay will be reviewed based on the attached rubric. If it does not meet the basic requirements of the rubric, it will not be considered.
- Scholarship enrollment is today March 31, 2018.

Essay Topics to Choose From

- 1) Express what you believe are the major differences between a community bank and a large chain bank. Which would you rather do business with, and why?
- 2) Consider ways that you could financially prepare to meet the goals you have set, and tell us about them. Will you save for a short term goal (ex: college, buying a car) or invest (ex: buying a house, saving for retirement), or both? Will you seek help to reach these goals? If so, how?
- 3) Describe a service project you have done or plan to do. How will it make a difference in your community? Is it possible to get others involved in order for your project to continue?

Submission Requirements

- Since this is a merit-based scholarship, we would not only like to see a great essay, but also a transcript that reflects the same work ethic. A transcript is not required, but will be considered when choosing our winner.
- The required paperwork should be hand delivered by the student to Community Savings Bank, anytime between now and March 31, 2018. Please introduce yourself!

How it will be awarded

- Community Savings Bank will contact the high school where the winner attends. CSB will arrange to
 present the winning student/s with a certificate at the school awards banquet at the end of their school
 year.
- When tuition is due to the school in which the winner plans to attend, the student can bring their certificate to Community Savings Bank. He/she will be mailed the awarded scholarship check, that must be endorsed by both the student and the school.

Scholarship Limits

- If the winner of this scholarship does not attend post-secondary school within one year following graduation, they will forfeit the scholarship. It will then be given to the runner-up.
- If the runner-up does not attend post-secondary school by that fall, the full amount of the scholarship will be put back into the fund and be awarded to another applicant the following year.
- If the employees of Community Savings Bank do not believe any of the applicants have met the requirements of the rubric, they have the right to withhold the scholarship and roll the funds to be used the following year.
- Essays copied from the internet will automatically be disqualified.
- Immediate family of Community Savings Bank employees do not qualify to enter.
